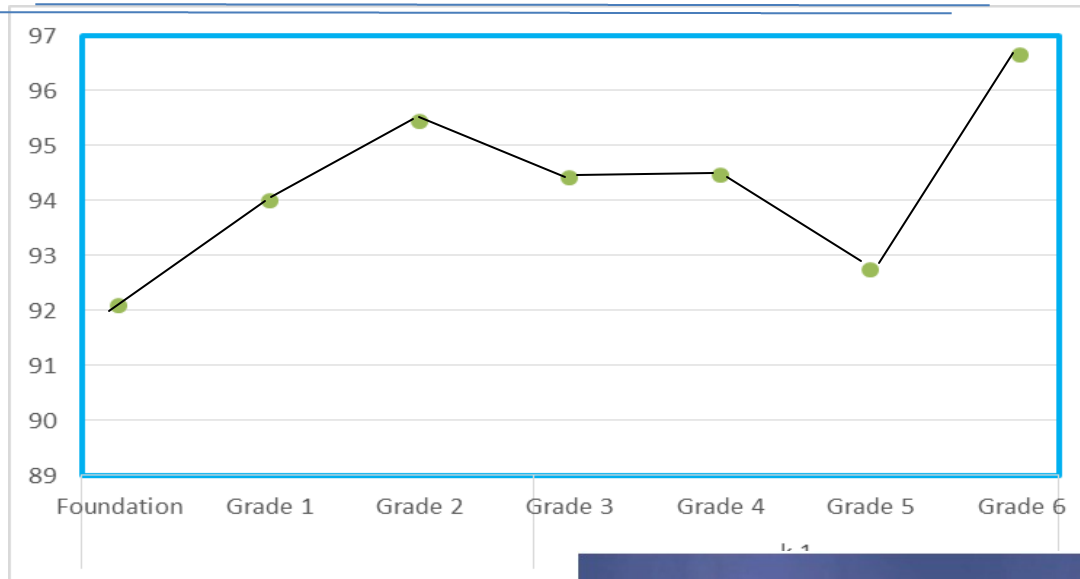

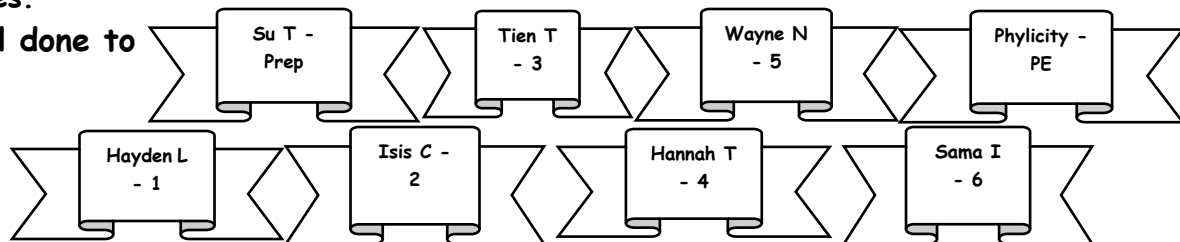


## PBS VALUES AWARD

### CHEMICAL-FREE TREATMENT FOR HEADLICE.

#### Coconut Oil with Apple Cider Vinegar.

1. Take melted coconut oil & apple cider vinegar in 3:1 ratio (eg. 3 parts of coconut oil mixed with 1 part of ACV).
  2. Spray/Massage into hair & scalp.
  3. Let it sit for few minutes & then comb through all the hair until the tangle-free with the help of a nit comb. It can be left in overnight then combed & washed out.
  4. The ACV loosens the nits & conditioner helps clear the scalp so they come off with the comb.
  5. Repeat the process twice a week to get rid of them.
- **Notes:** Coconut oil not only helps to get rid of the head lice but also rids the scalp of dandruff & makes the hair smooth & shiny.
  - Always use organic virgin coconut oil that is pure white in color & smells of coconut.
  - Coconut oil can be one of the most cost efficient, natural & effective approaches for treating head lice without products at home.
