We have been continuing our learning about positional language, data collection, recount writing and reading strategies. We had a lot of fun making some fairy bread and counting cars!







In the Year 1 Pod

This term the Year Ones learnt about Lifecycles and Minibeasts. We had the Marvellous Minibeasts incursion and students had a chance to hold and feed butterflies, dig for minibeasts and insects, touch caterpillars and explore the skins of minibeasts by looking through a microscope!



















In the Year 2 Pod

This term, our Year Twos have been diving into the important inquiry topic of Reduce, Reuse, Recycle. As part of our learning, we've been thinking critically about how our choices impact the environment and how we can take action to care for our planet.

To deepen our understanding, we've been exploring two powerful forms of writing: persuasive texts and poetry.

In our persuasive writing, students have been learning how to express their opinions clearly and convincingly. To strengthen their persuasive writing, students have been using the Burger Template to structure their arguments clearly, with a strong introduction, juicy supporting reasons, and a satisfying conclusion.

They've also been spicing up their writing with a range of persuasive techniques, including Simile Sausage, Authoritative Avocado, Eggplant Exaggeration, Rhetorical Relish, Egg Emotive Language, Fried Chicken Repetition, and Slurpee Statistics — each one adding flavour and impact to their messages about helping our planet!

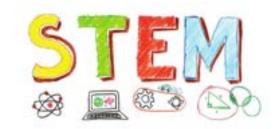

In Year Five, we have been learning all about light! We have learnt new vocabulary like 'reflection', 'refraction' and 'transparent'. Did you know that light travels more than 300,000 km per second! That's more than 7 times around the world in just one second!

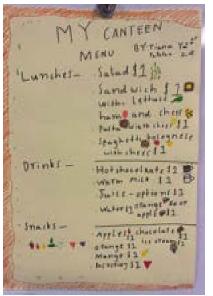

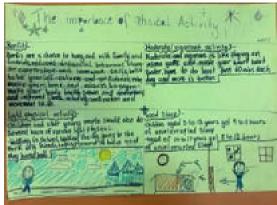


Health - Term 3

In Health, Foundation, Year One and Year Two students have been exploring the importance of **healthy eating**. They have enjoyed sorting foods into 'always' and 'sometimes' categories, learning to recognise which choices fuel our bodies best. Students have also investigated the different food groups and explained how each helps us grow strong and stay healthy. To put their learning into action, they designed their own healthy school canteen menus – full of delicious and nutritious ideas!

In Years Three to Six, students have been investigating how health messages influence our choices and overall wellbeing. They have analysed information and messages from the media, considering how these can shape decision-making, before creating their own projects to showcase their understanding. Students also explored the importance of regular physical activity, learning about the recommendation of 60 minutes of moderate to vigorous exercise each day. To put this into practice, they designed their own personalised weekly fitness programs, applying their knowledge in a practical and engaging way.

PE - Term 3

In PE this term, Foundation – Year Two students have been busy building their athletics skills, taking part in sprinting, relays, hurdles, shot put, and discus. Alongside these events, they have been strengthening their fundamental movement skills through a range of fun games, including favourites like skittle ball. It's been wonderful to see students challenging themselves, staying active, and enjoying the variety of activities.

Years Three to Six students have been building their athletics skills, taking part in sprinting, relay, hurdles, long jump, high jump, shot put, and discus. Alongside this, they have been developing their Futsal skills, putting their learning into action through exciting round-robin tournaments. It has been fantastic to see students showing great energy, teamwork, and enthusiasm across such a wide variety of sports.

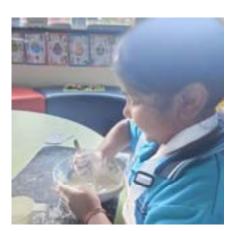
